
A Precious CHRISTMAS MEMORY

CHRISTMAS AROUND THE WORLD

I'm so thankful for Christmas and the season we celebrate the birth of Jesus. On that night everything changed and as we near Christmas I thought it would be fun to look at some of the ways that other countries celebrate Christmas.

SWEDEN

The Yule Goat has been a Swedish Christmas symbol dating back to ancient pagan festivals. However, in 1966, the tradition got a whole new life after someone came up with the idea to make a giant straw goat, now referred to as the Gävle Goat. According to the official website, the goat is more than 42 feet high, 23 feet wide, and weighs 3.6 tons. Each year, the massive goat is constructed in the same spot. Fans can even watch a livestream from the first Sunday of Advent until after the New Year when it's taken down.

JAPAN

Although Christmas isn't a national holiday in Japan (an estimated one percent of the population is Christian, according to Smithsonian Magazine), its citizens still find an interesting and delicious way to celebrate. Rather than gathering around the table for a turkey dinner, families head out to their local Kentucky Fried Chicken. The tradition began in 1974 after a wildly successful marketing campaign called "Kurisumasu ni wa kentakkii!" or "Kentucky for Christmas!" The fast food chain has maintained its yuletide popularity, causing some people to order their boxes months in advance or stand in two-hour-long lines to get their "finger lickin' good" food.

ICELAND

Similar to the 12 days of Christmas in the U.S., Iceland celebrates 13. Each night before Christmas, Icelandic children are visited by the 13 Yule Lads. After placing their shoes by the window, the little ones will head upstairs to bed. In the morning, they'll either have received candy (if they're good) or be greeted with shoes full of rotten potatoes if they're bad. And you thought coal was a terrible gift!

FINLAND

On Christmas morning, Finish families traditionally eat a porridge made of rice and milk topped with cinnamon, milk, or butter. Whoever finds the almond placed inside one of the puddings "wins"—but some families cheat and hide a few almonds so the kids don't get upset. At the end of the day, it is customary to warm up in a sauna together.

MARTINIQUE

In the French Caribbean island of Martinique, la ribote is a longstanding tradition where families visit their neighbors during Advent and on New Year's Day bearing holiday food like yams, boudin créole, pâtés salés, and pork stew. They sing Christmas carols together into the early hours of the morning, adding their own creole verses to traditional lyrics.

IRELAND

The Irish leave a tall red candle in a front window overnight, a welcoming symbol of warmth and shelter for the holiday season. Traditional Christmas fare in Ireland often includes homemade roast goose, vegetables, cranberries, and potatoes.

POLAND

On Christmas Eve in Poland, many families share oplatek (an unleavened religious wafer), each person breaking off a piece as they wish each other Merry Christmas. Dinner may not begin until the first star appears in the night sky and, traditionally, an extra setting is left at the table should someone show up uninvited

UKRAINE

Orthodox Christians make up nearly 49 percent of Ukraine's population; they observe Christmas Day on January 7 by dressing in traditional garments and walking through town singing carols. A dish called kutya, made of cooked wheat mixed with honey, ground poppy seeds, and sometimes nuts, is a popular Christmas Eve treat. Some families throw a spoonful of kutyaat the ceiling: If it sticks, there will be a good harvest in the new year.

SWITZERLAND

Swiss families make their own advent calendars for the holiday season. These calendars are either given to children as a surprise or made together as a fun activity. Each day's bag reveals a new surprise or treat, with the biggest gift on Christmas Eve.

NEW ZEALAND

Because summer falls during Christmastime for Kiwis, a number of their traditions center around a barbie, or grill, where families and friends gather for a casual cookout of fresh seafood, meat, and seasonal vegetables. The New Zealand Christmas tree is the Pohutukawa, a coastal species that blooms a bright-red color in December, providing shade during the sunny days as they sing carols in both English and Maori.

HE DID WHAT THE ANGEL COMMANDED

One of the many amazing parts to the Christmas story is the obedience of Joseph in spite of the possibility of public disgrace. In the culture of their time, the fact that Mary became pregnant while betrothed (engaged) to another man was quite a scandal. Upon finding out, people would assume one of two things: Either Mary was unfaithful to Joseph, or Joseph was not honorable in his actions with Mary. Knowing this, God sent an angel to speak to Joseph about what was *REALLY* taking place.

Matthew 1:20-21 (NIV)

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Can you imagine how the Christmas story would have been different if Joseph was not obedient to do what the angel said to him? Obviously, God knew Joseph's character before involving him in His plan, but it is important to know that Joseph STILL HAD A CHOICE in the midst of these events. At any point, he could have bailed out...but he didn't. He remained faithful to God and honorable to Mary.

Obedience is the way that each of us play an important role in the story of God. The obedience you show as you serve in and through the local church has a significant impact on the lives of others. Doing your part makes it possible for people to respond to the call of God. Obedience to the plan of God will often make us uncomfortable, or even push us to consider quitting before everything is complete. If we quit, we could miss being part of something truly spectacular.

Remember that your comfort or convenience is NOT always part of God's overall plan, but He longs to include YOU in all He wants to do in the world around you. I pray that Joseph's obedience inspires you to participate in the story God is writing for your life.

JOY TO THE WORLD

"Joy to the World" is one of the greatest & most popular Christmas carols of all time! It's the result of the efforts of 3 notable men. Isaac Watts, Lowell Mason & George Fredrick Handel. In his teen years, Isaac Watts, had once complained to his father that the songs sung in church were hard to sing. His father suggested, perhaps in jest, "Why don't you write something better?" So Isaac did. In fact, for the next 2 years, young Isaac wrote a new hymn every single week.

Watts grew to be an English poet and clergyman and by the time he died, he had written over 750 hymns! One day, sitting under a tree, Isaac began to compose some poetry richly inspired by Psalm 98.

The Psalm reads:

Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things; his right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. The Lord has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations. He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel; all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music; make music to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the sound of singing, with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn shout for joy before the Lord, the King.

Watt's love of the Lord was clear, but when he died, he probably didn't realize the impact his work would continue to have on the world.

You see, almost a century later, a man by the name of Lowell Mason, found Watt's poetry of Joy. Mason was a choir master from America and he very much wanted to publish Watt's poem into a musical composition. There was only 1 problem, he didn't have a melody to match the words. After much searching, he came upon a beautiful melody in Handel's Messiah.

So, Mason set Watt's poem to Handel's music and in doing so created one of the world's most beloved, wonderful and popular Christmas carols. "Joy to the World".

And "Joy to the World" is a carol like no other! While most carols proclaim the story of the birth of Christ, "Joy to the World" was actually written in celebration of the second coming of Christ. Pay attention to the powerful message in the last 2 verses of this incredible hymn:

No more let sins and sorrows grow, Nor thorns infest the ground; He comes to make his blessings flow Far as the curse is found.

He rules the world with truth and grace,
And makes the nations prove
The glories of His righteousness,
And wonders of His love.

It's a song that proclaims victory over darkness as sin and sorrow are abolished from the world! It celebrates the freedom that's coming through the truth and grace of a glorious, righteous and loving King!

Christmas isn't just about a fulfillment of God's promise. It's also PROOF! Proof that God KEEPS His promises.

"For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God." 2 Corinthians 1:20


