



## Parent Information

### **What will the kids do at camp?**

SOMO Kids Camp will be filled with swimming, rock climbing, mini golf, roller skating, water games, special ministry services, and lots of other activities.

### **How many campers are at each camp?**

Expect between 400-600 kids.

### **What is the ratio of dorm leaders to kids?**

We follow the National Standard of 1 worker per 8 children.

### **Where is the camp?**

Cross Pointe Camp and Retreat Center is located at: 31434 Main Street, Rocky Mount, Missouri 65072.

### **Are there licensed medical personnel at camp?**

Yes, there are medical personnel at the camp. All medications must be turned in to the medical personnel and distributed through them. Only medications that are prescribed by a doctor should be sent to camp.

### **Is there a dress code at camp?**

Yes. Clothing must be modest and appropriate. Modest swimwear is required. (One-piece suits preferred). Shorts, shirts, or dresses/skirts must be an appropriately modest length.

### **How long does camp last?**

Camp lasts from Monday 1:00 pm - Friday at 10:30 am.

### **Can a 7 or a 13-year-old attend camp as a camper?**

Camp is designed for children between the ages of 8 and 12. If you feel that the 7-year-old could do alright away from home for 4 nights and have a good grasp for understanding the teachings at their age then you make the call. If you have a 13-year-old with a demeanor that is more appropriate with Kid's Camp and you feel secure about their interactions with the younger children, then they may come.

### **What if a camper has food allergies?**

If it is an organic/health allergy or digestive disorder, they can bring their food in a cooler to camp and check it in at the First Aid Station to be monitored and checked out like medicine at meal/snack times. All food must be dated and labeled. If this issue applies to a child from your church, you must inform the CE Department in advance to ensure we have adequate storage space. There is a microwave in both the First Aid Station and also the cafeteria. There is no deduction on tuition for bringing their own food.

### **What should campers pack for camp?**

-Sleeping bag/bedding (twin)    -Pillow    -Recreational Clothes    -Modest Swimsuit    -Sunscreen    -Brush/comb  
-Modest Shorts & Shirts    -Beach Towel/cover-up    -Soap/shampoo    -Bath Towels/washcloths  
-Gym shoes    -Lake shoes    -Pajamas    -Toothbrush/paste    -Medicines (take to nurse)    -Bag for wet/dirty clothes

### **Should campers bring money?**

Yes, there will be opportunity for campers to spend money. We have a snack shop where kids can purchase items like French fries, soda and ice cream. We also have a camp store that sells camp apparel, gifts and toys. Additionally, the camp takes 1 missions project offering each week of camp. If your church has "opted in" to use Money Bands, your child will be able to use this cashless system anywhere on camp. As always, cash will always be accepted anywhere at camp.
