The Joel Generation

"And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions.

(Joel 2:38, ESV)

In a recent podcast with Ed Stetzer, world renowned author and pastor Max Lucado shared about his radical shift in theological views. Once an amillennialist, he now believes not only in a literal millennial reign of Christ on this earth but has also now accepted the view of a pre-tribulational rapture of the church. When asked why he changed his stance he stated that he changed because he could not get any other view to work with scripture. Carey asked him if he believed we are living in the end times and if so why. Lucado stated that he did believe that we are living in the end times and referenced Israel becoming a nation in 1947. He shared how before that time, many would have never believed the gathering of Israel as a nation was even possible. Many point to that event as the beginning of the last days.

This generation, our children and grandchildren, may very well be the Joel Generation...that last generation before the coming of the Lord. Personally, in recent years, I have seen a radical shift in the spiritual hunger of our young people. I can remember when I greeted at the first District Youth Convention as superintendent. Within sixty seconds from the time I was introduced, I felt I had totally lost the group as the young people began to talk to each other. In recent years, I have been astounded at our network youth events when I have had opportunity to greet at youth convention or at youth camps. As I step up to share a simple word from the Lord, I sense the hunger of the youth. Their eyes are looking and their ears are listening to what they can hear from the Lord!

As the older generation (yes that includes you under 40 ministers), we have a solemn responsibility to pour into this upcoming generation. We must do all that we can to encourage them, instruct them, and challenge them. We must pray for their safety and for a powerful infilling of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

While our four daughters were still young (actually before three of them were even born), Vicki and I would pray regularly that they would choose the right vocation and right mate. I remember the joy that I had in my heart when our last daughter was married and knew what she was going to do with her life. I knew our prayers had been answered with all four daughters married to quality young men and having clear direction on how God wanted to use them. Now we pray those same prayers for our eight grandchildren.

But recently, I found my prayers intensifying for our grandchildren. In recent years, we have seen many young adults go through deconstruction in which they literally walk away from their faith in Jesus Christ. In recent months, I have begun to pray, "Lord, may none of our grandchildren go through deconstruction! May their faith in Jesus Christ be so solid and sure that they never waver." I want their faith to be like the man who builds his house on the rock so when the winds and rains come, their house stands firm!

My days on this earth are numbered. (So are yours.) And I realize that my greatest legacy will be not so much what I do but the lives into which I invest. Jesus may come in my lifetime. However, it may very well be that my contribution to the Kingdom will not be going up in the rapture but investing in this generation so that they can radically affect their world for Christ. I am believing, hoping, and praying that God will use us...and our sons and daughters...to be part of the greatest spiritual awakening right before the coming of our Lord.

Testimonies were given of how God had changed peoples lives through the ministry of this local church. People responded to the preaching of the Word, and one made things right with God that morning.

The Holy Spirit led the Gaunt's to Purdy. People have been drawn by the Holy Spirit to Family Life Fellowship and now ministry is flowing out from this place of worship. People of all ages are being reached and ministered to because a Spirit

led and Spirit empowered church is actively ministering in Purdy.

I commend Wilson and Judy Gaunt for their anointed ministry in Purdy. I acknowledge all those that have come alongside the Gaunt's during this journey. Reaching Children in Africa

"Jesus loves the little children, ALL the children of the world!" His love has reached the children living in the small African country of Equatorial Guinea. Established churches and the Christian based elementary schools have provided the opportunity for children to know how much God loves them. Pastor and Justo Nguema were among the first students to attend an Assemblies of God preschool and elementary school. They were always the two top students of their class. In addition to the regular curriculum, the Nguema twins and all the students had a Bible class plus a weekly chapel. This prepared them with Biblical knowledge and they became involved in ministry to other children with their siblings and friends. Pastor became a leader of the

national ministry to children and trained young people to serve effectively. As a young adult and Bible school graduate, Pastor planted a church and currently serves as the pastor of this growing, vibrant congregation. Pastor's twin brother, Justo, is a medical doctor, and serves in the church as well.

Today, more than 2,000 students attend one of the Assemblies of God elementary schools in Equatorial Guinea, where they are learning to pray and study God's Word.

Two of the schools have our names. What an honor! Centro Privado Bilingüe Rhonda Deal and Centro Carlos Deal.

How Camp Changed My Life!


In the spring of 1994 I had just finished my Freshman year at Evangel College and started driving a dump truck for my uncle, Gary Cooper, to save enough to pay for the next year of college. As the 12-hour days passed, driving alone in a dump truck with no air conditioning and no power steering along a hot, dusty rock quarry, I realized this wasn't going to be for me. So, I cleaned the truck up, dropped it off at the garage, and let him know that I was going to find something else to do. That

next week my other uncle, Bruce McCarty, asked me to run games at SoMo youth camp for a month. This sounded like fun to me. I had been student body president in high school so this kind of leadership was right up my alley. And, for those who don't know me, I love to be around people. Let me set the stage by telling you about my childhood. My mom and dad were church druggies. They drug me to church every time the doors were open. I was the kid that seemed to always know the Sunday School class answers so that my team could win a competition. I also went to the altar many times through the years to receive the baptism in the Holy Spirit, lifting my hands and praying for so long, yet nothing ever happened. I remember one night at the altar one sweet lady finally said to me, "I just don't

think tonight is your night". This process of getting baptized in the Holy Spirit was frustrating to me. I liked church, but as I got older, I liked to work more than I liked to go to church. As I was starting my junior year in high school, my brother, Chad, was starting classes at Central Bible College to head into ministry. While I looked up to my brother, I didn't want to be a part of the ministry. I wanted to help students by being a High School Principal or being a businessman. I took off to work youth camp with my uncle and God began to do a work in my life like never before. The first week of camp kicked off and I began to meet great youth pastors like Dan Ross, Mike Kolhbaker, and many more who are now lead pastors in our Network. I led games each week and we played hard. It was a blast for me and the students alike. Therefore, I took that same energy and began to

pray for students. One night after praying for the students I had made my way to the right of the center of the stage and I began to pray. Then, a lady began to pray for me and I felt something hot on my back. The power of God was flowing through her into me. I had never felt the presence of God like that ever before. I began for the first time to see God differently. I saw a special needs student grab the camp speaker, Mike Goldsmith, by the throat and pray in Jesus name for his voice to be healed from

hoarseness and he was healed immediately and the hoarseness never did return to him. Over the next two weeks the stirring in my life got real. I remember praying at the altar one night and saying "I believe that You are real and I know enough to know that without Holy Spirit, I don't want anything to do with being in ministry." At Camp on week three in 1994 I knew that God had spoken to my heart about going into the ministry; it was clear. My response to God was again, "Not unless You fill me with the Holy Spirit." I still had to pay for college so after each week of camp I would drive back to Springfield and work at least twenty hours at the Fairgrounds. I showed up to the final week of camp completely exhausted but ready to give my all to the kids and to receive all that God had for



me. That week I was filled with the Holy Spirit confirming my call into the ministry. The Lord had taken my excuses away from me. I have served in ministry now for 28 years and have seen so many students and leaders walk away from camp with similar testimonies of what God has done in their lives. I have built into our annual church budget the funds to pay half of each camper's way to ensure that everyone can afford to attend. We take away the financial excuse. I believe that what happens at camp changes lives for the Kingdom and I want to help get as many as I can to kids and youth camps. More now than ever, it is a place where students set aside all their distractions, play hard, pray hard, receive the Word, and hear from God. Camp will always hold a special place in my heart as I continue to champion that cause.

Introductions

You probably know Mary Ann and I as the Lead Pastors of Blue Springs Assembly, in Blue Springs, MO, just outside Kansas City. In January, we will celebrate 28 years at BSA. We have watched as God steadily brought the church from a small, dysfunctional group of 60 in 1997, to a healthy, thriving congregation of over 400 today. We have guided the congregation through several seasons of growth, buying land, a 3-year capital campaign, and building our current worship center in 2008. Today, BSA is a generous, mission-minded church, sending many into ministry and missionary work around the world.

Pastoral Experience

After youth and associate roles in our early years in Springfield, MO and Waupaca, WI, we assumed our first lead pastorate in Shawano, WI at the ages of 23 and 25. We followed a well-loved pastor in his seventies who was retiring and jumped in to lead the church of 50 where the median age was 55, with one child in the nursery. Over the next 8 1/2 years, Shawano A/G proved to be a wonderful congregation that allowed us to grow personally and fostered a healthy environment that led the church to become the largest evangelical church in the county.

Mary Ann has been a true partner in ministry. For 25 years she was active in music ministries, leading worship, and writing and directing seasonal productions. She is creative, and passionate about exploring scripture, writing, and teaching God's word. She is a continuous learner and received her Ordination with the A/G in 2020. She has helped make BSA a church that respects and embraces women in ministry.

Network Experience and Education

I have thoroughly enjoyed serving the Kansas City Area as Presbyter, Assistant Presbyter, and Secretary/Treasurer for the last 15 years. Forming friendships with our local pastors has been a highlight for me. I am a graduate of CBC and AGTS, with an MA in Biblical Studies, and carry a certification in coaching. Mary Ann is a graduate of Evangel University, and is looking forward to beginning her Master's program in Theological Studies at AGTS in January.


We love the Southern Missouri Network, and believe the best days are ahead of us. We also love the local church and look forward to being a resource to our pastors and a champion of your vision and ministry.

3.5% of families will follow.


Yes, this shows the importance of a father and mother leading, but I am so thankful the 3.5% worked for this family!



Making a Difference Together: One Question At a Time






