## A Call to Payer

In the first year of his (Darius') reign, I, Daniel, perceived in the books the number of years that, according to the word of the Lord to Jeremiah the prophet, must pass before the end of the desolations of Jerusalem, namely, seventy years. Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy...

(Daniel 9:2-3a, ESV)

In just a few short weeks, we will gather at Central Assembly in Springfield for District Council 2022. This is shaping up to be a monumental event. Here are some things to pray about as we get our hearts ready:


- Pray that God will meet with us in a powerful way.

#### A Call for Powerful Effective Prayer for the Lost

"I'd rather be able to pray than be a great preacher; Jesus Christ never taught his disciples how to preach, but only how to pray." D. L. Moody

Our prayers cannot save a person, but our prayers can pave the way for people to accept Christ as their Lord and Savior. We should pray for the lost so effectively that they must climb over our prayers to go to hell.

How can we pray effectively for the lost?

#### I. TO BE EFFECTIVE IN OUR PRAYERS FOR THE LOST GOD REQUIRES CONSISTANCY IN OUR PRAYERS.

- Prayer for the lost is good and acceptable! 1 Tim. 2:1 "Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, [2] for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. [3] For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior"
- Jesus said that persistent prayer was what men ought to do. Luke 18:1 "Then He spoke a parable to them, that men always ought to pray and not lose heart. [2] saying: "There was in a certain city a judge who did not fear God nor regard man. [3] Now there was a widow in that city; and she came to him, saying, 'Get justice for me from my adversary.' [4] And he would not for a while; but afterward he said within himself, 'Though I do not fear God nor regard man, [5] yet because this widow troubles me I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.' "[6] Then the Lord said, "Hear what the unjust judge said. [7] And shall God not avenge His own elect who cry out day and night to Him, though He bears long with them? [8] I tell you that He will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?"
- The lost need our persistent prayers!
- We need to be balanced in our prayers for the lost! 1 Tim. 2:1 "Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men"
  - 1. Supplication means there is a specific request.
  - 2. Prayers is our requests to God.
  - 3. *Intercessions* is to enter into God's presence on the behalf of others
  - 4. *Giving of thanks* means that even in our prayers for the lost we must give thanks to God for all He has done!

#### II. TO BE EFFECTIVE IN PRAYING FOR THE LOST YOU MUST PRAY IN FAITH KNOWING IT IS GOD'S WILL TO SAVE THE LOST.

- It is God's will that everyone be saved. So when you pray for the lost you should have great confidence that God is hearing and answering your prayer! 1 Timothy 2:4 "who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

- You always know you are praying God's will when you are praying for a person to be saved.
- When you pray for the lost, pray the completed work of Christ. "5] For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus, [6] who gave Himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time"
  - 1. Man is separated from God because of sin but Christ stands as the Mediator between God and man. Pray knowing there is a mediator for the person you are praying for!
  - 2. Pray knowing that Christ paid the ransom for all. The price has been paid. God will not have to do anything else to save them. So, pray for the lost from a place of power not weakness!

## III. TO BE EFFECTIVE IN PRAYING FOR THE LOST WE MUST UNDERSTAND THAT A LOST PERSON WILL NEVER BE SAVED WITHOUT HEARING AND RESPONDING TO THE GOSPEL MESSAGE!

- Paul was not only praying for people he was telling them the good news about Jesus! "1 Timothy 2:7" for which I was appointed a preacher and an apostle--I am speaking the truth in Christ and not lying--a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth."
- We must pray that the lost person will have an effective presentation of the gospel. Romans 10:14 "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?"

#### IV. TO BE EFFECTIVE IN OUR PRAYERS FOR THE LOST WE MUST BE RIGHT WITH GOD OURSELVES.

- Paul's words given by the Holy Spirit were strong words. This was not Paul's wish it was the Spirit's command! "I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere" 1 Timothy 2:8
- Paul is saying that everywhere Christians meet, prayer for the lost must be offered.
- We can't struggle effectively in prayer for the eternal souls of men, women, teens, boys and girls, when we aren't right with God. 1 Timothy 2:8 " I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting"
  - 1. *Lifting up Holy hands* speaks of personal purity in our walk with Christ!
  - 2. *Without wrath*, angry people can't pray effectively for anyone or anything.
  - 3. *Without doubting* has the meaning of disputing with others which will hinder or prayers!

Conclusion – Praying for lost people works! Keep it up and you will see people coming to Christ! The lost can be rescued from their sins through the power of prayer.

## Disappointed with the Answer

Superintendent Don Miller called for a District-wide time of Prayer and Fasting for 21 Days this past January. It was so exciting to hear of the many ministers and churches that were taking part. Things happen when we pray and fast. I love the fact that the church I attend places great emphasis on prayer, and the results speak for themselves. We serve a God that can do anything, that is supernatural, and desires to meet the needs of His children.

Yet, have you ever been disappointed with the outcome/ answer to a prayer? This is a topic, that as Christians, we often ignore, afraid of what "God would think of us?" <u>As if</u> He can't "read our mind!"

I remember vividly when my Dad was diagnosed with leukemia at the age of 67. Such a godly man that loved his Savior, loved his family, loved his church, and loved people. Dad wasn't loud, didn't necessarily stand out in a crowd, but when he prayed things stood still and you knew that God's presence was there because he had spent time in the presence of God.

They told us at the doctor's office that there were 5 kinds of leukemia and he had the worst kind. With no treatment he may live 30 days, with chemo he had 50% chance of going into remission (which may last a couple of years). I remember thinking – 50%, surely with God on our side we're going to ace this. My God is the HEALER and I know He's going to heal my Dad, I need my Dad!!!!

We prayed, we fasted, he was anointed with oil time and time again, in fact the world was praying. But during the 7 months that dad lived, spending 4 of those in the hospital, he NEVER went into remission. In fact, it was a VERY difficult time, as we received bad medical reports over and over again. Dad went from a tall, strong man, to mere bones during this journey. He tried so hard to live, not afraid to die, but wanting to stay with his family.

After his death we all experienced various emotions. Did we trust God – YES! Did we understand why dad was not healed on earth – NO! Are we still serving and trusting God – YES! Did God reveal Himself through this journey – YES, time and time again! Most importantly, He sustained us, our relationship with Him grew deeper, and we were afforded the privilege to spend hours upon hours with Dad, time that we will always be so very thankful for.

In Philip Yancey's book, "Disappointment with God", he poses three questions that Christians wonder but seldom ask out loud:

Is God Unfair?

Is God Silent?

Is He hidden?

Our questions basically amount to this — **Is He listening and does He care?** We may never understand all of our "whys", as much as we would like to, BUT I have no doubt and I trust MY HEAVENLY FATHER! It only takes mere seconds to look backwards and see TIME, AFTER TIME, AFTER TIME, the faithfulness of God in my life. He always has been, He is, and He will be. FAITH is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. KEEP PRAYING, KEEP FASTING, and KEEP BELIEVING!





## The Biblical Basis for Ministry to Boys

Years ago, our national leadership realized the need to provide a ministry that would appeal to the unique interests of boys and provide churches with a platform to "reach, teach, and keep" boys for Christ. The product of that realization was the Royal Rangers program, and although many aspects of the program have changed since that time, the mission of Royal Rangers remains the same —to mentor boys into true Christlike manhood.

The mission of Royal Rangers and the methods we employ are based on ageless Biblical principles that endure beyond culture, politics, or personal preference. Luke 2:52 illustrates the multi-dimensional aspect of manhood modeled in the life of Christ as a young man: "And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." From



this verse, we can identify four distinct ways a boy grows: mentally, physically, spiritually, and socially.

From Christ's example, we see a picture of true and complete manhood that includes all four of these aspects of growth. Our boys must therefore also be challenged with opportunities to grow mentally, and physically, and spiritually, and socially. Any fully effective ministry to boys must promote development in all four of these areas to develop Christlike young men.

In Royal Rangers, the process we employ to promote growth in boys is to follow the simple pattern given to us by the apostle Paul in his letter to Titus: "Encourage the young men to be self-controlled. In everything set them an example by doing what is good" (Titus 2:6-7).



These words provide us with a clear process for leading boys into Christlike manhood—gender-specific, relation-ship-based discipleship and mentoring. Teaching boys Bible lessons and scriptural principles plays a central role in this process, but the best way for a boy to fully understand what Christlike manhood really looks like is to see it modeled in the lives of men he knows and respects—men who "set them an example by doing what is good."

Boys need a picture of manhood and a process for getting there. Scripture provides the picture in the life of Christ, but the process comes through regular interaction with everyday men who consistently model Christlike manhood before boys as they do life together, side by side, instilling within them faith, hope, love, service, and sacrifice, consistently providing a living image of the character of Christ.




