He is Enough

We thank God for the way that he met with us at Network Conference in April. Here is a recap of the Ordination message at Conference.

36 And at the time of the offering of the oblation, Elijah the prophet came near and said, "O Lord, God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that you are God in Israel, and that I am your servant, and that I have done all these things at your word. 37 Answer me, O Lord, answer me, that this people may know that you, O Lord, are God, and that you have turned their hearts back." 38 Then the fire of the Lord fell and consumed the burnt offering and the wood and the stones and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench. 39 And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces and said, "The Lord, he is God; the Lord, he is God," (1 Kings 18:36-39).

Israel had strayed far from God. The religious leaders not only allowed but promoted idol worship; particularly Baal and Asherah. Elijah was used by God to draw the nation of Israel back to the true God! He challenged the prophets of Baal to a duel on Mount Carmel. All of Israel gathered for this monumental contest. He challenged the Israelites. "How long will you halt or limp between to opinions." If the Yahweh is God, follow him. If Baal is god worship him! The true God will bring the fire!

The prophets of Baal went first. They prepared their sacrifice and began to call upon Baal. They worshipped from morning until noon but there is no answer. Elijah begins to mock them. Maybe your God is musing (lost in thought). Maybe he is relieving himself. Cry louder... maybe you need to wake him up. In desperation, the false prophets begin to cut themselves trying to get their god's attention.

Suddenly there is a shift in the atmosphere. He may have not said it out loud, but the cry of Elijah is "Enough!" Enough of a people wandering around worshipping false God. Enough of frantic useless action that is producing no spiritual results. Enough he says, "Come near me. Turn your attention on me as I turn your attention on the true God."

In our world, it is time for us to cry out, "Enough! Enough of people searching for peace and hope in all the wrong places. Enough of destroyed lives and families. Enough of people dying needlessly from drug addiction. Enough of depression dragging many into a pit of despair. Enough of children being sold into sex trafficking. Enough of spiritually empty, lifeless churches that are not impacting their world.

Could it be that the world has lost respect for the church because we have lost the power? Enough! May we be able to say to our world, come near to us and we will show you God!

Elijah could not cause the fire; he could only prepare for the fire. He repaired the altar of the Lord that had been thrown down. Sometimes an altar will be neglected. Life happens, things get busy, or everything seems to be going fine; no real need to reach out to God. In those times, it is easy to neglect the altar, to neglect the relationship with God. One can grow cold and indifferent toward the things of God. But the nation of Israel went one giant step further. They had torn the altar down. It was a deliberate defying of God; turning their backs on the true God to worship other things.

In our nation, we went through a time of neglect toward the things of God. But like the nation of Israel, we have reached a new low. We have seen the throwing down of the altars. There was a tolerance toward spiritual things. Now there is an abhorrence toward Christianity and Jesus himself. If you continue in a place of neglect long enough, it will bring you to a place of defiance. How many areas has American torn down the altars

and begun to believe in false gods for provision and blessing? How much drought will it take for them to wake up.

When we come to Mount Carmel, there had been no rain for threeand one-half years. But the drought does not awaken; it is the fire of God that awakens! No matter how bad things may get, we will always find an excuse or an explanation. Crops are failing and storms are increasing; it must be global warming. Homosexuality is rampant; it must just be that we are finding ourselves. We are just pushing off antiquated inhibitions which have limited our freedom. We could go on and on. In the midst of the messed-up world what many would call freedom, we find is not freedom at all. In reality, those away from God are not free; they are slaves to the sins that control them.

Now Elijah begins to rebuild the altar of the Lord! By his actions, Elijah is declaring, "The Lord He is God!" He is turning his heart and the heart of Israel toward the Lord. Elijah prays a simple prayer, "Let it be known that you are God and that I am your servant! Answer me that they may know you." And the fire fell consuming the sacrifice, the water, and the stones! And the people cried, "The Lord he is God."

We are in a time in our world and our nation when we need the fire of God, the power of God more than ever before. We have gone past the point of needing a revival; we need an awaking. Revival can stir from neglect. An awakening wakes the death. Our altars have not just been neglected...they have torn down. We cannot cause the awakening to come. But we can do our part to prepare.

We like Elijah must rebuild the altars which have been torn down!

We must rebuild the altar of repentance. It begins with the repentance of those who are called by his name, it begins with his people! We must allow him to search us, to know us, to convict us. We must turn from that which grieves God and seek him with whole surrender.

We must rebuild the altar of prayer. I was prompted a while back with a concerned thought how in times past young preachers often learned to pray by being around older preachers as they prayed. They learned to call upon God as they listened to the prayers of others. I believe one of the reasons that the church has not seen the power of the past is because we somehow skipped a generation and no one taught our young ministers to pray by example.

We must rebuild this altar. This will happen in the secret place, in the closet of prayer. But may we not only rebuild the altar of prayer in our own lives; may our public prayers carrying the power from our private prayers prod others along to call upon God. Let's rebuild the altar of prayer! (I would challenge you to get Rick Dubose's book on prayer, *In Jesus' Name:* 5 Altars of Prayer that Move Heaven and Earth.

We must rebuild the altar of example showing the world who Jesus really is. We do this by letting Jesus shine through our lives. We rebuild this altar by allowing the Spirit of God to flow through us. The gifts of the spirit were never designed to stay within the four walls of the church. I believe that in these last days, we are going to see believers move in the prophetic not in some weird way but supernaturally.

Our world, our nation is ripe for awakening. As Elijah waited for just the right time, I believe it is just the right time for the church of Jesus Christ to rise up! God is looking for some Elijahs who will get close enough to him to hear his voice. He is searching for men and women who, full of his Spirit, will cry out to this world, "Enough!" He will raise up committed men and women who will rebuild the altar and show them Jesus!



He is Enough

Joshua 1:9 – Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.



When you ask or allow individuals to carry a weapon on behalf of your organization or while serving your organization, much of that responsibility and liability for their actions transfers to your organization. Therefore, we strongly recommend that only highly trained individuals be allowed to carry a weapon as part of a formalized security team. Generally, an armed security team of untrained volunteers is the least desirable option, because they often lack the training and experience to handle a weapon safely in a high-stress situation. Additionally, it could cost significantly more to acquire security guard insurance in such a case.

If I have armed security, will it be covered in the event of an armed intruder?

First and foremost, each situation is evaluated independently. If liability insurance for security guards is not specifically excluded, you generally have coverage depending on your situation. However, an armed security team is an additional exposure that must be reviewed by Church Mutual's underwriting department. There is also an additional survey that needs to be completed. You should provide the survey, along with your security team policy/procedures, so that our underwriting department can review them and determine potential armed security insurance costs.

Why might CM exclude security guard insurance?

An armed security team creates an additional exposure that may not be covered in your policy. Church Mutual must review your security policies and procedures to determine acceptability for security guard general liability insurance. If they do not meet best practices, we may add an exclusion, and we may provide recommendations to help you develop an acceptable security team exposure.

What might make a team unacceptable for security guard insurance?

- · No policies/procedures and written security plan
- · No training or minimal training
- No background checks on security team members
- · Fully automatic weapons

- Security team members under the age of 21
- What about concealed carry holders at my church are they covered?

When it comes to concealed carry in church by members or visitors, it is your choice to either allow or prohibit weapons in your facility. It is imperative, however, that those individuals and your organization comply with local or state laws, and that you document your decision within policies, procedures and/or signage. As a best practice, anyone carrying a concealed weapon who is not a part of a formalized armed security team should not be carrying a weapon on behalf of your organization or while serving your organization. If you choose to allow for concealed carry, members and visitors should be carrying on their own behalf and in the interest of self-defense, thus bearing responsibility for their own actions. Be mindful: If you allow a concealed carry holder to serve in a nonsecurity related function (usher, teacher, etc.), you may still be liable. If there is an armed security team, we recommend that you don't allow concealed carry on the premise. This could result in confusion for the armed security team and members of the organization, should an event ever occur.

What to do before implementing armed security

If your organization has decided to start an armed security program, there are some important steps you should take first:

- 1. Know your state laws about the type of weapons security guards can carry. If there are specific licenses required in your state, armed security guards should acquire those licenses.
- 2. Post notices that you are using armed security guards. Communication is vital, as visitors to your organization may be alarmed by the sight of weapons.
- 3. Perform background checks on all individuals who will be armed. Part of the requirements for security guard insurance are that each person who carries a weapon must undergo a criminal background check.
- 4. Require that your armed guards undergo regular training. Most states require that armed guards go through training on each specific weapon at least once every six months.

Things I've Learned...

For nearly eight years, I have had the privilege of serving our Network as the Director of Church Health. Over that time, my health team and I have assisted well over 60 of our churches through The Acts 2 Journey, worked with dozens of pastors and church leaders to form vision and strategy to move their churches forward, and filled the pulpit of many churches who were looking for their next pastor.

As I have reflected on my time in Church Health, I am reminded of a few things I have learned along the way. These are the things that will help me as I return to being a lead pastor in a local church...and maybe they will help you too.

- **1. HONEST Assessment is CRITICAL!** If you aren't willing to look at what needs improvement in your church, or in your leadership, you CANNOT get better! If you cannot handle honest feedback, you will only gather people around you who SEE things the same way you do, or who will only SAY what you want to hear.
- **2. Vision & Mission are IMPORTANT!** The Scripture says, "Where there is no vision, the people perish!" (KJV) In the ESV translation it says, "Where there is NO PROPHETIC VISION, the people CAST OFF RESTRAINT?" (ESV)
 - That means that people who do not see or hear vision being talked about or pursued will become disillusioned and give up. They will unhook themselves from the plowing crew and find another place to invest themselves!
- **3. VALUES Trump EVERYTHING!** Common Values (core values) SHAPE the culture of your church. Most church conflict happens because of differing value systems among the people.
- **4. The Lack of STRATEGY AND EXECUTION will undermine your ability to LEAD...and may even KILL your ministry/church.** So...we said earlier that "Where there is no vision, the people perish." But, "Where there is no STRATEGY AND EXECUTION... NOTHING happens!

I see this as the MAJOR cause of failure in churches. They had GREAT VISION...but NO step-by-step process of how they were going to achieve it! Ultimately, nothing happened.

Serving in this role has truly been one of the highlights of my life and I am thankful for the opportunity given to me by our Superintendent and Network leadership. I will be forever impacted by my interactions with some of the finest men and women serving in the local churches of this Network as pastors, deacons, and ministry leaders. Our greatest days are ahead of us... NOT behind us!

This "It's not enough" attitude has helped me accomplish many great things in life and ministry, but if I'm not careful, it leaves me feeling unfulfilled and focused on the wrong things. The Apostle Paul wrote about some of his "fleshly" accomplishments in Philippians 3. If anyone had reason to boast in their accomplishments, it was Paul. Before coming to Christ, he followed the law blamelessly. After his Damascus Road Experience, he planted at least 14 churches. Paul could've gloried in those things, but instead, he found his fulfillment in Christ. Philippians 3:7-9 reads: "But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith." Jesus is enough! Our accomplishments and accolades, our future successes are garbage compared to knowing Christ. Everything in this life is temporal, but who we are in Christ will last forever!




