I Believe In the Christ of Christmas

Luke 2:10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

I believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God, the anointed Messiah was sent into this world to save man from his sin. I believe He came to this earth born of the virgin that's what I believe Christmas is all about.

There is a lot of time and money spent on promoting Christmas as just a winter celebration. Many say that Christmas is just a spirit of giving and there is no need to mention Christ and His birth.

When the angels announce the birth of Jesus and they promise the shepherds a sign. Luke 2:12 *And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger.* This promise of a sign was to give the shepherds a reason to believe that the Christ had come into the world.

Let me share what and why I believe in the Christ of Christmas.

WHAT I BELIEVE ABOUT THE CHRIST OF CHRISTMAS.

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST I DO NOT HAVE TO LIVE IN FEAR. Luke 2:10 *Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid,*

- Christ was born, He lived, He died, and He rose again, that the fear of death might be destroyed. Heb. 2:14 Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death--that is, the devil-- and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.

- When Jesus saved us He didn't give us a spirit of fear. 2 Tim. 1:7 For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST THERE IS REASON FOR GREAT JOY. Luke 2:10, *I bring you good tidings of* great joy which will be to all people.

- Peter described our experience with Christ in this way. 1 Peter 1:8 whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory.

- Paul told about the kingdom of God. Rom. 14:17 for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST THERE IS A SAVIOR FOR A LOST WORLD. Luke 2:11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior,

- The angel told Joseph in, Matt. 1:21 *"And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins."*

- The writer of Hebrews tells us of the great saving power of Jesus.

Heb. 7:25 *Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him.*

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST I HAVE THE LORD TO GUIDE MY LIFE AND FIGHT MY BATTLES. Luke 2: 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

- Christ means anointed one of God. He our anointed warrior Prince. Psa.18:1 "I will love You, O LORD, my strength." 2 "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold." 3 "I will call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised; So shall I be saved from my enemies."

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST I SHOULD GIVE PRAISE AND GLORY TO GOD. Luke 2:13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 14 Glory to God in the highest,

I BELIEVE BECAUSE OF THE BIRTH OF CHRIST I HAVE PEACE. Luke 2:14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

Eph. 2:13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. 14 For He Himself is our peace,

- The sign promised the shepherds. Luke 2:12 And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."

- A virgin conceived and a son was born. Mat 1:23 Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us.

THERE ARE IRREFUTABLE SIGNS THAT WE HAVE TODAY.

- The signs of history. The birth, the life, the death, and the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

- Yet there is another sign that is real to me today. 2 Pet 1: 19 And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts

Rom. 8:16 *The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God*,

I offer you something to believe in that is a lot better than Santa. I offer you Christ the Savior and the Lord.

Joy was in the house! The Central Assembly of God church located in Bata, Equatorial Guinea, was packed, the chairs under the tents outside were full, and people were standing or sitting wherever they could find a place around the building. Bible school students were graduating and pastors were being ordained. It was a time of celebration for all that God had done. Each student and each pastor have a story of how God's gift of salvation changed their lives. A few years ago the tent meeting in Malabo, the capital city of Equatorial Guinea had the same exuberant joy. The tent was full and many people were standing outside. Why the celebration? In both cities, the people were enjoying the benefits of our Heavenly Father's greatest gift for man, which is salvation.

God gave His Son to be the Savior on the first Christmas, and the benefits of salvation are joy, hope, love, forgiveness, and peace.

A young teenage girl came into the church in Malabo over thirty years ago. Many days she was carrying a fish in a pan on her head walking around the city to sell as she helped her family provide a home and food. One day in a Bible study she responded to the question of what salvation meant to her, and she replied, "I have hope." She was still living in a humble home with parents who had addictions, but salvation had provided her with this benefit of God's gift to man. Hope. Today, she is the pastor of a village church and serves the national church as the treasurer. She continues to share the message of salvation so that others have the benefit of hope.

God loved us and gave His Son as a sacrifice. (1 John 4:10) God loved us while we were sinners. (Romans 5:8) The angels announced to the shepherds that Jesus was born in Bethlehem as a Savior. (Luke 2:11) God sent Jesus because He loved all of us.

God loved a couple who did not have peace. He loved a young woman, who did not have peace. They are just two examples of several people who were afraid of the spirits that controlled their life, but they received forgiveness and peace in their hearts. God called the couple into the ministry and they raised a family who continue to preach and teach about God's love and the peace He can provide. The young woman had assisted with abortions, but she walked by the tent, sensed the joy, walked in, asked God to forgive her, and He gave her peace, and soon called her to minister to children. God calls and sends people to all areas of the world, at home and abroad, to preach and teach about this Greatest Gift that He sent to the earth over 2000 years ago. People serve other gods and sacrifice to them because of fear. There is no joy, no hope, no forgiveness, and no peace. They have not heard the Good News of Great Joy! The shepherds heard the news and after they met the baby Jesus in the manger, they shared the news with all who would listen.

As we looked over the congregation that was at the Equatorial Guinea General Council in September, there was joy in our hearts for this Greatest Gift to man. The testimonies of God's grace and mercy are thrilling to hear and to remember. The downtrodden found joy, the hopeless found hope, the unloved found love, the troubled by spirits found peace, and the unforgiven found forgiveness.








 Gift-giving at Christmas is a tradition that is centuries old, but like most things, gift-giving has changed drastically over the years. I remember when the Sears, J.C. Penney, and Montgomery Ward catalogs were delivered to the house each September. My younger brother and I would almost wear the pages out looking and dreaming of what we wanted for Christmas, and then we would (not so subtly) leave the pages circled, underlined, and highlighted for our parents to find so they knew what we wanted for Christmas.

Our family (six kids) was like most who didn't have a lot of extra money, so what we wanted was often weighed against what we needed when it came time for mom and dad to purchase gifts for Christmas. Nearly every year we received socks, gloves, or underwear because those were the items we either outgrew or wore out during the previous year. I'm certainly not complaining because my parents always made sure me and my siblings had the things we NEEDED, and when they could...they got us a few of the things we wanted too.

I often think of those memories when I read the Christmas story. The prophecies of Messiah were widely known among God's people, but over time they became fixated on what they WANTED Messiah to be and do for them when he arrived. It was almost like they were circling, underlining, and highlighting their "catalog" for God to know what they were hoping to receive.

Their focus upon what they WANTED is why most people missed Christ's birth. Jesus (Messiah) came into the world in a very UNEXPECTED way, and proceeded to minister in a very UNEXPECTED way. The people of God WANTED deliverance from an oppressive government and a king of their own, but Jesus came to establish a heavenly Kingdom instead of a political one. They pictured Messiah as a conquering King on a white stallion, but Jesus was a helpless baby born in a stable.

Jesus was not the Messiah they WANTED... but he was definitely the Messiah they NEEDED!







We celebrate the Cardboard Boat Regatta on Stockton Lake where over 120 leaders, boys, family, and friends joined with us as our boys raced across the lake in cardboard boats they had built. All the boys survived the ordeal, although most of the boats did not (as usual).

We celebrate the Family Fun Day held at Ozark AG in September where over 120 people from the nearby area joined us for a day of games, prizes, and a free lunch. This event provided a memorable experience for the whole family.

We celebrate the FCF Territorial Rendezvous that took place near St Louis where FCF members form 10 districts gathered for a week of games, competitions, fellowship, and spiritual renewal. This event took place at Camp DuBois where Louis & Clark camped before proceeding up the Missouri river to explore the Louisiana territory. Our district brought the largest group with 47 members attending.

And we celebrate all the other training classes, meetings, conferences, and other events that brought us together as brothers and friends to share great times, pray together, and encourage one another along the journey of this Christian life. Growing into the men we were all created to be is a process that requires time and effort. But it also requires friends, those who are always faithful to come alongside and help.

Next year the journey continues, and wherever it leads, we'll do it together like friends and family. We'll see you on the trail!
