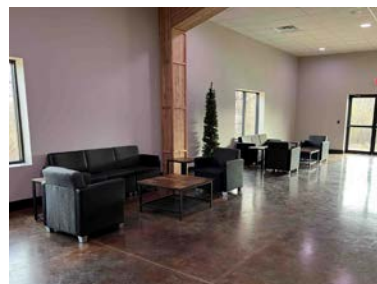
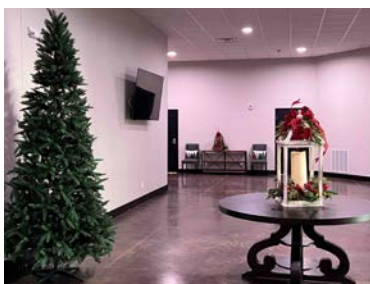
# Camdenton First A/G Building Dedication

 As softly a church choir sings*

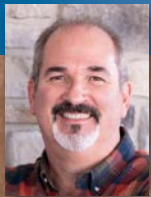

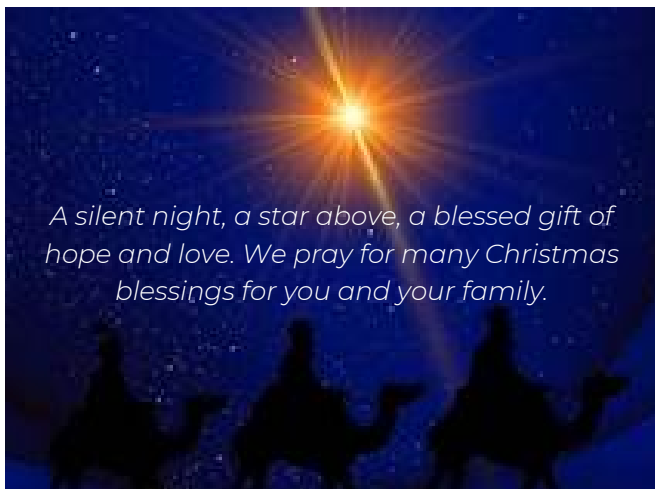
Throughout church history, and in particularly our Assemblies of God history, starting new churches has proven to be the most effective way of bringing "hope," the message of Christ, to our generation.
